## HORSEHEATH PARISH COUNCIL

A meeting was held on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> November in the Village Hall. In attendance was the Parish Clerk Bernard Yallop, County Councillor John Batchelor, District Councillor Richard Barrett, Roger Hickford from Linton and one parishioner.

### **District Council news**

Richard Barrett wanted to remind us all to separate out papers into the paper caddy that fits in the top of the blue bin so that the Council can maintain its income from this source. The community funding budget will be cut again next year.

### **A1307**

Roger Hickford, Chairman of Linton Parish Council came to tell us about reviving the A1307 Steering Group, which we shall be supporting as it co-ordinates the efforts of all the Parishes along the route. There has been a 40% reduction in the accident rate in the last 3 years so we are no longer in the top 10 'accident clusters' in the county. This is good news but unfortunately counts against us for future investment, so it particularly important to keep up the pressure.

### **Affordable Housing**

The plans for the three dwellings in Audley Way have now been submitted to the District Council.

### **Speeding**

The plans and proposals for physical speeding controls for the village will cost up to £25,000 for 'pinch-points' at each entrance to the Village, if they fit, plus a modified T-junction by the Village Green. The roads in Cardinals Green are too narrow for 'pinch-points' so the Highways Dept. are recommending more signs and road painting. They are currently drawing up a scheme for detailed costing. We are submitting a grant application for £10,000 and hope to hear about this in the new year. In the meantime we are told that 30mph signs on our wheelie bins are effective as a weekly reminder and we intend to purchase and distribute these.

### **Commemorative stone in Church wall**

We will be removing the stone on the front Church wall and re-cutting the lettering in the New Year. We hope to find a time capsule behind, which we plan to update and replace. We will hold another 'Memories' event to show the contents along with the latest documents and photographs for the village archives collection, which continues to grow. ### **Salt bin**

We are placing another bin near the corner of Alington Terrace to help clear the cycle racks area and the diagonal path from the bus and thank David Luckham for volunteering to spread the grit.

### **Maintenance**

We are chasing for action on the overhanging branches from the Church trees, which have been started but not finished.

The next meeting will be on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> January 2013 at 7.45pm in the Village Hall. All welcome.

## CRIME PREVENTION AT CHRISTMAS TIME

Christmas is a busy time of the year for everyone, including the criminal. However, a high percentage of crime is opportunist in nature. This Christmas we are seeking your assistance in preventing this type of crime.

### Your Car

**Presents left in full view:** Keep presents and other possessions out of sight – if they can be seen they can be stolen.

**Car Left unlocked:** Always close windows, engage steering lock and lock all doors.

**Keys left in ignition:** Never leave keys in the ignition, even for a short period of time, especially if defrosting your car on a morning.

**Bank cards, mobile phones, Sat Nav systems in glove compartment:** Take all valuables with you. These items are on a car thieves 's shopping list.

**Parking in dark secluded areas:** Park in a well lit area or in an attended car park. Look for the Park Mark aware logo for safer parking – check out the following website: [www.safeparking.com](http://www.safeparking.com).

### Your Home

**Doors and windows not secured:** Ensure all doors and windows are locked.

**Presents displayed under the Christmas tree:** Presents should be kept out of view.

**Empty boxes left outside:** Dispose of present packaging as this will advertise you have new goods inside.

**Car keys and handbags conveniently placed:** Never leave car keys and handbags lying around on display.

**The unoccupied look:** Out for the evening? Make it look as if someone is at home. Use timer switches. Going on Holiday? Ask a neighbour to keep an eye on your house - Join a Neighbourhood Watch or Countryside Watch scheme.

### Your Property

**Unmarked Property:** Mark your property using an ultra violet pen or forensic marking solutions. Register your property (anything with a serial number) free on [www.immobilise.com](http://www.immobilise.com).

**Carrying large amounts of cash:** Do not carry large amounts of cash. Be alert and make sure your purse/wallet is secure and hidden from view.

**Chequebook and card left unattended:** Never keep your chequebook and card together. Keep your pin number confidential.

**House Insurance:** Make sure you are covered for the value of goods in your home.

**Passing stolen goods:** If you are offered a quality product at a bargain price ensure the source is genuine.

If you see anybody or any vehicle acting suspiciously in your area please do not hesitate to report it to the Police. 101 for non emergencies and 999 for emergencies.

## **EAT, DRINK AND BE MERRY THIS CHRISTMAS!**

As the party season approaches and we stock our cupboards for the festivities, many of us are also watching the pennies. Everybody likes a bargain, especially when there are presents to be bought, journeys to be made and all sorts of other expenses chipping away at the bank balance.

With this in mind, Trading Standards would like to warn readers about the pitfalls of buying alcohol from unconventional sources such as car boot sales, strangers at the pub, workplace or selling from the back of a vehicle or any other unusual sources.

In recent times there has been an increase in the amount of counterfeit and fake alcohol found in the county. Counterfeit alcohol, just like any other counterfeit product, mimics a genuine branded article and tries to pass itself off as the genuine product. Usually the counterfeit product is very convincing and most consumers wouldn't notice any difference in the packaging.

As well as counterfeit alcohol there are drinks designed to look like new and appealing brands. Often these products do not meet the required legal standards of composition – either having too little or too much of certain required ingredients or featuring ingredients that shouldn't be present at all. Often these ingredients can be harmful to health.

Indeed, both counterfeit and other fake drinks should be avoided at all costs. They may contain either much more or much less alcohol than stated on the label and than is required by law but worse than this, however, is the fact that many counterfeit and fake drinks contain chemicals that are normally used in products such as cleaning products, antifreeze and screen wash. For example methanol, isopropyl, propan-2-ol, acetone and chloroform are commonly found in illicit alcohol.

Needless to say, these products can be dangerous if consumed and pose a risk to health. For example, people have been known to be sick or suffer dizziness, breathing difficulties, kidney damage, blindness and even death after consuming fake alcohol.

Nobody can tell what's in a bottle of fake drink and so the risks are unpredictable. The simple message is to not buy or consume any drink of questionable source.

So if you choose to eat, drink and be merry this Christmas, please do so in a way that is safe and doesn't risk your health or that of your guests.
