Dear Friends

The beginning of June marks the celebration of Trinity Sunday (7 June). It is purportedly on this Sunday that more heresy is preached in Church than at any other time. This results from the well-meaning intention of clergy to try and explain how it is that we have one God who is three persons – Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

From New Testament times the Church has sought to express what it had experienced of God. God as Father in heaven, the constant unchanging God, the law giver and creator, who spoke and it was. Their experience of God the Son, Jesus the man in whom they saw God at work, walking around Palestine, teaching, healing, suffering dying and rising again. And God the Holy Spirit present with them at all time and in all places, working with them, guiding and developing their lives.

In all this they saw not three different Gods but one God. What the Father did was not separate from the Son or the Holy Spirit; they worked together in perfect harmony and co-operation. But they still recognised three separate points of action. The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, what they did could be described in different ways - the Father created, the Son redeemed, the Holy Spirit sanctified. The Father was outside space and time, remote transcendent, not subject to the changes and chances of the world. The Holy Spirit was close, but still unlimited, in all places and at all times here and everywhere. The Son was as close to man as you could get, he was one of us, but as such limited to space, time and history. This was the experience of God that was formulated as the doctrine of the Trinity - One God: Three persons.

The doctrine of the Trinity expresses not just our experience of God but also the range of our need for God. One God: Three Persons.

When in life we are going through bewildering changes we need the experience of God as Father, the constant unchanging God. In time of pain and suffering we need the Son who suffered and can sympathise with our humanity. When things are dull and boring we need the Holy Spirit to inspire us and move us forward. There is no part of our lives from which God as Trinity is excluded, no need that he cannot meet.

There is no aspect of life that is not covered by some aspect of the Trinity. Particularly In these difficult times we need the whole Trinity to give us balance.

The Trinity is a mystery - I cannot explain why God is like that, Three Persons: One God - God just is. But God has revealed himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit - a God who is available to us at all times and in all places who is unlimited even by the constraints of human logic. Three Persons: One God - So he is.

A Parish Council meeting was held by remote video on Monday 11 May. In attendance were our Parish Clerk Melanie Laing, our District Councillor Geoffrey Harvey and our County Councillor Henry Batchelor.

The South Cambridgeshire District Council (SCDC) planning committee will be held by video in future to maintain planning functions. Business relief grants of up to £25,000 are available during the Covid-19 pandemic.

The Council has introduced a new Communities Capital Fund of £5m which is open to voluntary groups working in village communities. There is an extended deadline for this year's Local Highways Initiative bids. Installation of average speed cameras along the A1307 should occur between the 6 July -9 August. Both Councils are holding committee meetings again so the full range of services are being delivered.

**Village Activity during the Covid 19 pandemic** – the Parish Council remains keen to support all villagers and act as a conduit for local information during the emergency period. There is an active network of volunteers undertaking shopping and prescription collection, as well as social contact over the telephone for those who are housebound or isolated. The Parish Council would like to extend their sincere thanks to all

the volunteers who have been helping the community in this way. The Parish Council has developed a local resources list (coordinated by Niki Murray) which has been widely distributed. If residents have any ideas for additional community support at this time please contact John Howard.

### **Planning**

*Replacement boundary to cellar steps – Horseheath Lodge - supported*  
We await a decision from SCDC on *New vehicular access, Church Farm*

**Grant for the Cricket Club** – We have agreed to provide a grant of £750 for maintenance work in the cricket pavilion.

**Trees and Woods** – The Thurlow estate are seeking to move the trees that have been planted near The Thatch in Cardinals Green along the verge of Howards Lane nearer to Arbour House in the autumn to improve access to their field.

**Annual Parish Meeting – Friday 17 April 2020 7.30pm** - This has been cancelled due to the current emergency. *Please note we intend to continue to hold Parish Council meetings by remote video in the future, and residents are welcome to take part in those meetings. For more information please contact Mel Laing by email who can provide a link to the meeting for interested residents.*

**Grass cutting and village maintenance** – We have begun the new mowing policy in line with Plantlife’s recommendations; in future some areas will be cut less often to support wild flowers and pollinators and welcome your comments on this change. We are hoping to commence this years programme of village maintenance soon.

**Local Highways Initiative** – The new crossing point at the junction of the A1307 and Howards Lane is functioning but negotiations are continuing with regard to making this crossing suitable for all users. We have received the design proposals for our 2019-20 application (to increase warning of the 30mph zone on the West Wickham Road).

**The Neighbourhood Plan** – Although work on this has stopped because of the Covid 19 emergency, we have begun discussions with the Thurlow Estate about how they can be involved in our plan.

**Maintenance** – We continue to chase individual items, but encourage people to complain independently to Cambs County Council at [www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk](http://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk) where there is a “report a highways fault” form. We understand there is a greater likelihood of action with more public complaints.

**Meetings** – The additional meetings we attend are not happening at the moment.

It has been an extraordinary couple of months and I am sure that none of us could have predicted the situation that we now find ourselves in - these have been challenging times indeed. Following the Government announcement in March that all schools will be closed to pupils, except the children of key workers, life has changed significantly for us all. I only hope that everyone is keeping well and I send my thoughts, prayers and best wishes to everyone in our community.

Our pupils are now learning at home, with tasks provided remotely by their class teachers. This different way of working has been challenging for us all, but the staff and I are so grateful for the incredible support we have received from our school parents and families. The learning taking place has been truly exceptional and if you have a few moments to visit our Facebook page, you will see the range of activities the children have engaged in. The pupils really are being extremely well cared for, both academically and emotionally.

There has been a lot for us all to consider following the announcement on Sunday and the Government has continued to publish further guidance relating to the re-opening of schools on 1 June (Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 only). Although the guidance has been helpful in some instances, it does leave us with many questions when we look at how we can effectively make this work in our school. The Governing Board, staff and I are working hard to address these questions and find the right way forward. The Local Authority, led by our Service Director Jonathan Lewis, has also being incredibly helpful and there is much going on behind the scenes to ensure that the safety of our community remains at the heart of all our decision-making.

We will do all that we can to provide the safest environment for the children, families and our staff, but I am sure that everyone appreciates the challenges that we will be working with. With the measures we need to take, school will be a different experience for some time. However, please do not be alarmed by the pictures that you may have seen in the media of social distancing in schools abroad. Rest assured that we will do everything we can to make sure the children feel comfortable, happy and enjoy their time back with us. Our key worker children, who have attended school every day since March, are always smiling and have adapted to the "new normal" well. They have shown tremendous resilience and it has been a pleasure to work with them. It has also been rewarding for the staff and I to feel that we are, in a small way, supporting their parents, whose work is so critical to the national effort. In the next few weeks, we will continue to risk assess and plan for a broader re-opening, but we will not lose sight of how the COVID-19 situation is developing nationally. This will inform our decision-making.

I would like to finish by thanking my colleagues in school who have made the daunting task of navigating through this difficult time seem manageable and achievable. Their dedication and resolve has been an inspiration – thank you.

I'm sure like so many, I was struck during the recent VE Day commemoration across the nation, that people of a far younger generation chose to commemorate those dark days of 1945 in so many innovative ways, in spite of the restriction of Lockdown.

Allow me to add briefly, my wife and her family would never forgive me for not mentioning their dad, who was still at War in the Far East hanging on under the Japanese yoke of grim captivity for another three months after the riotous VE Day celebrations had begun in Trafalgar Square.

In spite of the unimaginable cruelty, in which he endured nearly four years of slave labour working on the notorious "Death railway" incredibly Wally Crissall came home.
