Dear Friends

Normally at this time of year I choose to write something about holidays, but clearly this year the whole holiday scene is going to be somewhat different. I know that as things open up the opportunity to get away for few days becomes a possibility, but whether we choose to take that opportunity to jet away to a sunny beach and a blue sea or stay safely at home could well depend on what sort of people we are. So, this year I will refrain from remarking on relaxing holidays on sun-kissed beaches.

Earlier in July in preparation for the Churches reopening for worship I was typing up the readings sheet and was particularly stuck with words in the collect for Trinity 5 (a prayer used by the Church on Sunday 5 July the day we reopened). The collect asks '*O God, the protector of all who trust in you, without whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy: increase and multiply upon us your mercy; that with you our ruler and guide we may so pass through things temporal that we lose not our hold on things eternal*'. Clearly in the last few months none of us has been able to avoid being affected by the Covid virus, some more so than others. Even for those of us who have been relatively little affected there have been limitations on where we can go, what we can do and who we can see. The collect prayer made me think, though, that it isn't so much what happens to us in life but rather how we respond to it.

I think that we are lucky that so many people responded positively to the constraints of the Covid virus, stepping up to help their neighbours, ensuring people had food and received the medication they needed. People could have chosen to be entirely selfish to just look after number one, but most didn't. Most people have, also, respected the efforts key workers have made to maintain the important services. Although things are now opening up we are far from out of the woods and we will still need those key workers to do their stuff.

The Covid pandemic has clearly demonstrated that whoever we are we cannot avoid bad things happening to us, and in those bad times that we can act well and be really good neighbours. Perhaps we should bear this in mind when times get better and so keep the impetus for goodness going and continue '*to so pass through things temporal that we lose not our hold on things eternal*'

A Parish Council meeting was held by remote video on Monday 13 July. In attendance were our Parish Clerk Melanie Laing, our District Councillor Geoffrey Harvey and our County Councillor Henry Batchelor.

The South Cambridgeshire District Council (SCDC) has agreed a zero-carbon strategy for South Cambridgeshire. SCDC hopes to reduce its carbon footprint by 45% by 2025 and 75% by 2030. SCDC has launched the second round of bids for a Zero Carbon Grant; up to £15,000 is available to support energy efficient community building refurbishment, community cycling projects or tree planting.

A Local Liaison Forum meeting will be held to discuss works on the A1307 up to Wandlebury on Tuesday 21 July and again further along the A1307 on Monday 10 August. Greater Cambridge Partnership (GCP) has now agreed a route for the proposed Cambridge metro from South Cambridge to the A11 (see <https://www.greatercambridge.org.uk/asset-library/CSET-PH-2-project-update-July-2020.pdf>).

Library services, except mobile libraries, and the marriage registration service, including civil ceremonies, are now functioning again. Linton Library opens on Monday 3 August.

### **Planning**

*Various exterior work to outbuildings – Horseheath Lodge - supported*  
We await a decision from SCDC on *New vehicular access, Church Farm*

**Village Activity during the Covid 19 pandemic** – the Parish Council remains keen to support all villagers and act as a conduit for local information during the emergency period. We believe support for those who are at risk continues to be necessary even though the national lockdown is easing. The local resources list (coordinated by Niki Murray) has been a useful source of information for residents and we intend to continue to make this available. We are seeking to support local businesses in reaching and providing services to residents.

**Supporting the Village Hall Refurbishment** – the Parish Council agreed to do all it can to support the refurbishment of the Village Hall, particularly with regard to supporting grant applications.

**Greater Cambridge Partnership proposals for a westbound bus lane on the A1307 in Linton** – this proposal was supported by the GCP Board recently. The proposal is for a new bus lane stretching from the Bartlow turning to the junction with the B1052 in Linton. The bus lane would cost £1 million pounds and would currently benefit just the X13 bus route (3 buses a day in peak traffic). The bus lane is projected to save 2 minutes per bus journey. The existing hedgerow would be removed and the road widened. Linton Parish Council and Horseheath Parish Council have objected as the proposal does not appear to significantly benefit other road users, to be ecologically damaging and very expensive.

**Local Highways Initiative** – The new crossing point at the junction of the A1307 and Howards Lane is functioning and a pinch gate at the junction has been removed opening the path to cyclists and horse riders. New warning bollards have been installed at other footpath crossing points including the Harcamlow Way.

**The Neighbourhood Plan** – Work on this has stopped because of the Covid 19 emergency. We are continuing to consider how we can protect the green space in the village.

**Maintenance** – We continue to chase individual items, but encourage people to complain independently to Cambs County Council at [www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk](http://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk) where there is a “report a highways fault” form. We understand there is a greater likelihood of action with more public complaints.

**Meetings** – There is a meeting of the A1307 Parishes Forum on Tuesday 14 July by Zoom.

## **CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE & RESCUE SERVICE**

### **Summer fire safety**

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service is urging residents to take extra care while outdoors this summer. With temperatures rising again, fires in open areas of land can easily spread and become out of control.

Group Commander Paul Clarke, head of community fire safety at Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service, said: “We want to help ensure that people enjoy the sunny weather while it’s here safely. High temperatures and dry areas of land can be perfect conditions for a fire to spread. Something as simple as not stubbing a cigarette out properly, or using a disposable barbecue on grass, can start a fire that can develop quickly.”

There are some simple steps we urge residents to take to help prevent an outdoor fire:

1. Put disposable barbecues on bricks, do not place directly on grass.
2. Ensure cigarettes are completely out
3. Do not throw cigarettes out of car windows onto grass verges or vegetation
4. Do not leave glass bottles lying on the ground, the sun’s rays reflect through the glass and can start a fire
5. Use barbecues on a hard, flat surface, away from grass, shrubs or fencing
6. Talk to your children about the dangers of starting a fire.

## DIZZY'S DAY NURSERY

You may have noticed that a yurt, parachute, fire pit and young children have appeared in the paddock behind Church Farm and wondered what is happening? The answer is that we have created a Forest School for very small groups of children from Dizzy's Day Nursery in Haverhill.

The Forest School provides the nursery with an 'outdoor bubble' a few days a week, so that children can continue their early years education while places in nursery are limited due to Covid-19. The Forest School ethos promotes children's learning and exploration in the outdoors and involves many activities that couldn't be achieved in an indoor environment. Forest School is proven to support children's learning, emotional resilience, social development and respect for nature. This week the children were amazed and intrigued by all the tiny frogs that were in the paddock and surrounding woodland leading to discussions about camouflage and life cycles. I am sure that we have many more exciting discoveries ahead.

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
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
