A Parish Council meeting was held by remote video on Monday 14 September. In attendance were our Parish Clerk Melanie Laing and our District Councillor Geoffrey Harvey.

The Zero Carbon Grant is still available from South Cambridgeshire DC; a bid from the village is being developed to provide double glazing in the Village Hall. Attention was drawn to the availability of financial support for the self-employed under the government's Covid provisions; more information is on the South Cambs website or directly from Geoff Harvey.

The installation of the 50mph average speed cameras on the A1307 should occur this month. The Greater Cambridge Partnership (GCP) has withdrawn the proposed travel hub at Linton. Plans for the new roundabout at the Bartlow Road junction and the closure of the north bound east turn at the Dean Road

crossroads have been presented to the Local Liaison Forum. There has been additional local representation, including from our MP Lucy Frazer, about the GCP's proposed west bound bus lane at Linton as there has been strong local feeling that this proposal would not be cost effective.

### **Planning**

*Barns south of Howards Lane* – proposed demolition and erection of a new dwelling (previous approval based on a Class Q agricultural conversion application) – out for consultation – a separate planning meeting will be held.

*Various exterior work to outbuildings – Horseheath Lodge* – granted 6 August  
*Single storey extension to front and rear -19 Audley Way* – granted 8 September

We await a decision from SCDC on New vehicular access, Church Farm

**Resignation of Rachel Paintin from the Parish Council** – we were sorry to receive Rachel's resignation after 3 years as a Councillor. This vacancy will be formally notified on our notice boards and the website; please contact John Howard for information should you be interested in joining the Parish Council.

**The Wildwood Disco in Crofts Wood** – the Parish Council has received some expressions of concern about the events held in the wood adjacent to the Point to Point on the 21-23 August and 12-13 September. These related to the volume and duration of noise from the events and the use of the farm access to the site. The Parish Council will be writing to the South Cambs Licensing Office to record these issues.

**Wild flowers in selected road verges** – Terry Mundy has made an application to Anglian Water's Pebble Fund which aims to increase biodiversity. Our application is intended to enhance the numbers and species of wild flowers in selected road side verges around the village.

**Trees and Woods** – There continues to be considerable interest in establishing a new wood within the village as a new common and protected green space. Terry Mundy is initiating enquiries about available land. We understand that if a freehold or leasehold land purchase is possible, some residents would be prepared to contribute financially to the project. Please contact John Howard for further information or to express an interest in supporting this project.

**Supporting the Village Hall Refurbishment** – the Parish Council has received a Section 137 grant application from the Village Hall Committee. The Council will seek some further information to ensure the requirements of Section 137 funding are met but was sympathetic to the request.

**Social housing** – we have now received a report on potential sites for new social housing from Hastoe Group. Outline discussion with Greater Cambridge Shared Planning and landowners will now occur.

**Local Highways Initiative** – We are awaiting the installation of new warning signs prior to the 30mph zone at the commencement of the village on West Wickham Road.

**The Neighbourhood Plan** – Work had stopped because of the Covid-19 emergency; it now appears the governments White Paper on planning may further affect the influence of Neighbourhood Plans.

**New Traffic Mirrors** – have been installed at the Mill Green turn and the bend in Howards Lane in Cardinals Green.

**Maintenance** – We are awaiting the installation of LED lamps in our streetlights.

We continue to chase individual items, but encourage people to complain independently to Cambs County Council at [www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk](http://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk) where there is a "report a highways fault" form. We understand there is a greater likelihood of action with more public complaints.

**Meetings** - We continue to attend the A1307 Parishes Forum and the GCP Local Liaison Forum.

Although we have done our best to make our Parish Council virtual zoom meetings accessible to residents, the Parish Council feels that our meetings are not accessible or transparent enough. We therefore plan to organise our next meeting as a socially distanced – probably outside – face-to-face meeting. Details will be widely shared nearer the date of the meeting which is 9 November.

**WE NEED YOUR HELP - OUR SPEEDWATCH TEAM** is critical. Our current volunteers are very willing but there are **not enough volunteers to run the scheme** with any effect. **PLEASE CAN YOU SPARE 2-3 HOURS A MONTH TO BE A SPEEDWATCH VOLUNTEER?** Training is provided. ### **WALLY CRISSALL'S WAR.....AND PEACE.**

Whilst serving in the last war during the "Far East" campaign Wally Crissall saw his brief call to arms brought to an abrupt halt. Along with many more Allied soldiers, including colleagues from his cherished "Suffolk" regiment, he fell captive at Singapore in February 1942 after a devastating whirlwind Japanese attack in which Wally and thousands more were unceremoniously "herded" onto the golf course. Subsequently they were dispatched hundreds of miles away to work on the notorious Thai-Burma (Myanmar) "Death Railway." Ever since, their sobering story has been woven into the rich tapestry of British military history, becoming known thereafter as the "Forgotten Army".

Many harrowing accounts have subsequently come to light revealing the unspeakable hostility toward those stricken POW's in which incredibly some survived the relentless cruelty at the hands of their uncompromising captors. Yet, for the remainder of his life Wally never forgot those who were left behind. From then..... until he died 16 years ago..... Wally's many recalled wartime recollections as a FEPOW were passed down to his children, which while he lived and delivered in his dry Suffolk accent had a deeper, meaningful connection to his extraordinary past wartime experiences.

Fast forward 75 years to just over a month ago on 15 August 2020, all three of Wally's children, Robert, Colin and Christine, having all been raised in Horseheath, and now currently married with children and grandchildren of their own ensured his memory, along with many more former valiant comrades, is also never forgotten.

This year, were he alive, Wally would have celebrated his very own personal 100 year birthday, which the family chose to commemorate in their own individual way by hanging "VJ Day" Union flags (thanks to Colin, who over recent years has touchingly collated a whole archive dedicated to his dad's unique history) to be displayed outside their respective homes. Family members young and old throughout Horseheath and beyond, chose 15 August 2020 to remember and commemorate Wally's life, along with so many more past servicemen and women who sacrificed their lives three quarters of a century ago.

In typical modest fashion Wally would have demurred to be singled out as anything other than an adored dad and grandad in the eyes of those who loved him best. However, to those who came to know Wally after the war had ended, the family's tribute is a poignant reminder that there was a true sense of having been fortunate to have been able to know him as a friend too. He was perceived by many to possess a rare quality, and whether spotted chatting over a pint in our local Red Lion, or seated in his kitchen polishing off his daily diet of crossword puzzles, it was apparent you were in the company of somebody very special, who like so many more of his former comrades was truly deserving of the title " Unsung Hero!"

## **CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE & RESCUE SERVICE**

### **Getting ready for winter**

As the colder months draw in, we begin using our fires, burners and chimneys once again to warm our homes. Chimney Fires continue to be a common occurrence in home fires in the winter months.

### **To ensure you keep your home safe from fire, follow our top tips below:**

- Whatever fire you have or fuel you burn it is vitally important to have your chimney swept to avoid a build-up of ash and soot
- Avoid burning resinous woods (that quickly build up soot)
- Only burn fuels suitable for your burner (eg never burn anything other than wood in a wood burner)
- Do not overload the grate/appliance
- Do not bank fires too high and remember to let them burn out well before you go to bed
- Check the hearth, floor and furnishings near the fire for hot sparks/embers
- Do not place objects on or over the mantelpiece which cause you to stand too close to the fire in order to reach them
- Use a fire/spark guard to prevent accidental fires and make sure it has the kite mark or conforms to British/European standards
- Inspect your chimney breast, particularly the roof space. Make sure it is sound and sparks/fumes cannot escape through cracks or broken bricks

Most importantly, always fit a smoke alarm and test your alarm weekly, and ensure a Carbon Monoxide (CO) alarm is installed in the room where the burner is.

I visited the Cambridgeshire Volunteer Hub to hear more about the fantastic work they have been doing during lockdown – they have provided a valuable lifeline for our most vulnerable during the pandemic, getting food to the most vulnerable and providing advice and support. I have also seen first-hand so many fantastic local volunteer groups going about their work delivering prescriptions, cakes and just keeping in contact with those who would otherwise be alone.

Lockdown has made all of us work and think differently. In my own office, we have had regular teleconferencing calls and I have kept in touch with local stakeholders including parish councillors, businesses groups and volunteers using Zoom. My surgeries have also gone virtual! Technology has been a lifeline in keeping us connected but I know that many of us are keen to replace safely meeting in person soon.

Shops and small businesses are re-opening and during shopping trips to Ely, Newmarket and Cambridge it has been reassuring to see the measures that people are taking to safely social distance, protecting their employees and customers. These include perspex screens, masks, sanitising stations and one-way systems. Customers are returning to shop in person and I encourage you to do the same to help support our businesses, both big and small.

The Government is now focussing efforts on maintaining jobs and strengthening the economy as we come out of lockdown.

They have pledged a £160 billion support package and are committed to helping keep people in work, ensure young people get jobs and bring back people into sectors hit hard by the virus. Some measures include cutting VAT for tourism and hospitality businesses, the Eat Out to Help Out scheme as well as a reduction in stamp duty. These measures will help to get us back on track.
